### Free H1N1 Vaccinations

San Joaquin County Public Health Services is encouraging all residents to get vaccinated against the H1N1 Influenza. Even this late in the season, the vaccine affords the best protection against H1N1. Vaccinations are now available through a number of sources, including doctors, clinics and pharmacies. Public Health offers H1N1 vaccinations free of charge, with emphasis on reach those persons without health insurance or who cannot afford to pay a fee.

During the month of January, Public Health will also host a series of H1N1 vaccination clinics throughout the county. We would appreciate your assistance in getting the information out to your congregations in San Joaquin County. Please note that year-round public health immunization clinics are also located in Lodi, Stockton, Manteca and Tracy.
