There will be a survey sent out by the end of this week regarding the Great Delta Trail Master Plan, it is important that farmers, reclamation districts, and delta residents fill the survey out, this will help shape the plan. San Joaquin County is included in the master plan for the Delta Trails.
- b. Ag Commissioner's Report:

- i. Proposed neonics mitigations will be out soon and will be open for public comment.
- ii. Surveying for our drought declaration sometime in May, UC Extension does grass cuttings in areas where dryland grazing takes place to get an idea what the feed supply is like. This helps if any programs open up through FSA or NRCS regarding money available for drought programs.
- iii. Cherry season opened up strong last week their expecting a strong crop this year.
- iv. Got a call from California Department of Food & Agriculture that they had found a lantern fly egg mass that was on a pod that was shipped from Pennsylvania to our military installation in Lathrop, we did go inspect it. Currently the State has proposed a quarantine that would help with treatment before stuff can be moved into the State. That is currently at the office of Administrative Law.
