SB 1383: Short-Lived Climate Pollutants Reduction Act

SB 1383 is a California state law designed to reduce the amount of organic waste disposed of in landfills, thereby decreasing methane emissions. It aims to achieve a 75% reduction in organic waste disposal by 2025. Additionally, SB 1383 requires that 20% of edible food currently thrown away be recovered for human consumption by 2025.

Who is Affected:

- Tier 1: Wholesale food vendors, food service providers, food distributors, grocery stores (≥10,000 sq ft), and supermarkets.
- Tier 2: Hotels with onsite food facilities and 200+ rooms, restaurant facilities (\geq 5,000 sq ft or 250+ seats), health facilities with onsite food facilities and 100+ beds, state agency cafeterias (\geq 500 sq ft or 250+ seats), local education agencies with onsite food facilities, and large venues and events.
