The County of San Joaquin (County) receives federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the purpose of assisting low- and moderate-income persons to obtain decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanded economic opportunities. HUD requires that the County develop a five-year plan for the use of funds, known as the Consolidated Plan. The 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan will address how the San Joaquin Urban County will use Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds. The San Joaquin Urban County is comprised of the unincorporated portions of San Joaquin County and the cities of Escalon, Lathrop, Manteca, Mountain House, Ripon, and Tracy.

The County will hold a Community Meeting on Wednesday, November 20, 2024, from 3:00-4:30 p.m. to discuss the development of the 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan; to explain how CDBG, HOME and ESG funding may be used; and to receive public comments on the needs of low- and moderate-income residents. The meeting will be conducted virtually to allow for flexibility among interested people and garner as much participation as possible.
