WHY MUST BUSINESS AND MULTI-FAMILY COMPLEXES RECYCLE?

It's the law! AB 1826, AB 341, and SB 1383 play an important role in California's efforts to protect the the environment by increasing diversion of organic materials away landfills and toward production of value-added products such as compost. fertilizers, and biofuels. Compost, made from a mixture of food and yard wastes that have been fully decomposed, can fertilize and condition soil; and healthy soil is critical to reducing carbon in the air. Keeping recyclable compostable materials out of the garbage is an excellent first step toward cost savings and improved operational efficiency.

DID YOU KNOW?

- By adding recycling services, businesses and multi-family complexes can save money by decreasing the size of garbage bins and frequency of service.
- By recycling, more items are kept out of landfills, extending the life of these facilities.
- Recycled materials that are used in manufacturing are, in most cases, more cost effective than the use of virgin materials.
