NOTICE

Establishing Proposed Service Charge & Public Hearing

August 14, 2024

Dear Property Owner:

You are receiving this Notice because you own property within Lockeford Maintenance District (District), which is a special district administered by San Joaquin County (County). The District provides storm drainage services to the properties within the District's boundaries. The Department of Public Works is advising you of a proposed rate structure for this service and the Public Hearing regarding its establishment.

The District was formed in 1965 and did not include a storm drainage service charge. The primary funding source for drainage services comes from interest income; and yet costs associated with managing the storm drainage system exceed the interest income earned. A proposed rate structure is required to properly align the District's revenues with the cost of providing service and contribution to capital replacement revenues. The contribution towards capital replacement is phased in over five years to provide property owners with a gradual increase in the rate.

The proposed rate structure is for five years. District fees are a flat rate charge based on the Single-Family Equivalent (SFE) unit. This is the level of service received by the average single-family residence. The proposed charges, if approved, will be effective fiscal year 2024-2025 through fiscal year 2028-2029. The charges will continue after this time period at the fiscal year 2028-2029 rate, and any additional increases would require another notice of proposed increase and Public Hearing. The service charges are annual and will continue indefinitely for the purpose of covering all the necessary expenses to operate, maintain, and replace the District's public utilities for services.

The San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors will consider adoption of the increase at a Public Hearing on:

Any written protests must be received by the San Joaquin County Public Works Department office at 1810 E. Hazelton Ave., Stockton, CA 95205 by 5:00 PM on October 7, 2024, or submitted at the Public Hearing prior to the close of the hearing.

If the proposed rate structure is not passed, service levels within the District will need to be reduced to generate cost savings. The following cost reduction measures may be implemented:

- · Reduction of after-hours and weekend service calls
- Reduction of regular maintenance of the system
