<b>June 10</b> (E-148)	<p><b>Governor’s Proclamation – Issuance</b> On or before this date, the Governor shall issue a proclamation calling the General Election and shall state the time of the election and the offices to be up for election and transmit a copy of the proclamation to the board of supervisors of each county. <b>June 24</b> (E-134)	<p><b>Administrative District Office Confirmation and Boundary Line Notice</b> Deadline for districts consolidating with election to deliver confirmation of offices, measures, and boundary lines.</p> <p><b>Administrative Specifications of the Election Order</b> Deadline for school boards to deliver this document to the county superintendent of schools and the county elections official.</p>
<b>July 1 – July 15</b> (E-127 to E-113)	<p><b>Municipal Notice of Election Publication</b> For cities consolidating with this election, the city clerk shall publish a Notice of Election between these dates. This notice shall contain the date of the election, polling hours, any offices to be filled and/or measures to be voted on, the qualifications required for each office, location where the Declaration of Candidacy forms will be available, where the forms are to be filed and the deadline for filing these forms.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Elections Code § 12101, 12111</i></p>
<b>July 8 – August 7</b> (E-120 to E-90)	<p><b>County Notice of Election Publication</b> Publication of the notice of election is between these dates. The notice contains the date of the election, any offices to be filled, the qualifications required for each office, the location where the Declaration of Candidacy forms will be available, where the forms are to be filed, and the deadline for filing these forms.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Elections Code §§ 12112, 12113</i></p> <p><b>Notice of Random Alphabet Drawing Publication</b> Publication to news media and other interested parties of the place and time where the Random Alphabet Drawing is to be held.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Elections Code §§ 13112(b)(1)(B), 13112(c)</i></p>

<p><b>July 15 – August 9</b> (E-113 to E-88)</p>	<p><b>Declaration of Candidacy and Nomination Period</b> All candidates, including incumbents, may pick up nomination papers at the Registrar of Voters Office during this time. <i>Elections Code §§ 8020-8021, 8040-8041, 8060-8070, 8100-8107, 8800-8811</i></p> <p><b>Submittal of Form 700 Candidate Statement of Economic Interest</b> Period in which candidates who have not submitted a Form 700 within the previous 60 days must file Form 700. (U.S. Senate, congressional, and central committee candidates are exempt.) <i>Government Code §§ 87200-87203, 87500</i></p> <p><b>Optional Candidate Statement of Qualifications Submittal</b> All candidates who opt to include a Candidate Statement of Qualifications in the county voter information guide provided to voters by the San Joaquin County Registrar of Voters Office must submit a statement and pay the deposit when filing the Declaration of Candidacy. Statements may not be changed but may be withdrawn up until 5:00 p.m. of the next business day after the close of the nomination period. <i>Elections Code §§ 13307-13308</i></p> <p><b>State Senator and Assembly Candidates Only</b> The period in which statewide candidates opt to include a 250-word Statement of Qualifications in the county voter information guide only if they have agreed to accept the voluntary expenditure limits on their Candidate Intention Statement (Form 501). <i>Government Code §§ 85600, 85601</i></p>
<p><b>July 30, 2024</b> (E-98)</p>	<p><b>Ballot Designation Change Deadline</b> The last day that a candidate can submit a written request to change the ballot designation as used in the primary election. <i>Elections Code §13107(h)</i></p>
<p><b>July 31, 2024</b> (E-100)</p>	<p><b>Semi-annual Campaign Statements Due</b> Last day for all required candidates, organizations, committees, and slate mailers to file semiannual campaign statements. Period Covered: - 6/30/24 <i>Government Code §§ 84200, 84218</i></p>
<p><b>August 7 – November 5</b> (E-90 to E-Day)</p>	<p><b>Late Contributions and Independent Expenditures of \$1,000 or More</b> Within 24 hours of the transaction, FPPC Form 462, Form 496, or Form 497 must be filed with the appropriate filing officer. Period Covered: Ongoing <i>Government Code §§ 82036, 82036.5, 84203, 84203.3, 84204, 84215(e), 85204, 85309</i></p>
<p><b>August 9</b> (E-88)</p>	<p><b>Declaration of Candidacy and Nomination Period Ends at 5 p.m.</b> Deadline for all voter-nominated, non-presidential, and county central committee candidates to file all required nomination papers. <i>Elections Code §§ 8020, 8022</i></p> <p><b>Form 700 Candidate Statement of Economic Interest</b> Deadline for candidates to submit Form 700. (U.S. Senate, congressional, and central committee candidates are exempt.) <i>Government Code §§ 87100-87500</i></p>

<p><b>August 10 – 14</b> (E-87 to E-83)</p>	<p><b>Nomination Extension Period</b> If the incumbent fails to file a Declaration of Candidacy by the deadline for their office. There will be a 5-calendar day extension period during which any candidate, other than the incumbent, may file for office. <i>Elections Code §§ 8022, 8024, 8100, 8105, 10225, 10407, 10516, 10604</i></p>
<p><b>August 10 – 19</b> (E-87 to E-78)</p>	<p><b>10-day Public Examination Period for Statement of Qualifications</b> The public examination period for offices that close during the nomination period. <i>Elections Code § 13313</i></p>
<p><b>August 14, 2024</b> (E-83)</p>	<p><b>Last Day to Submit Political Party Endorsements</b> Deadline for the chairperson of any qualified political party to submit an official list of candidates who have been endorsed by the party to the county elections official. <i>Elections Code § 13302(b)</i></p> <p><b>Appointments Submitted to the Board of Supervisors</b> A letter requesting the names for appointment by the Board of Supervisors in lieu of election. <i>Elections Code § 10515</i></p>
<p><b>August 15, 11:00 a.m.</b> (E-82)</p>	<p><b>Randomized Alphabet Drawing</b> The SOS and the ROV will conduct a drawing of letters to determine the order in which candidates appear on the ballot. <i>Elections Code § 13112</i></p>
<p><b>August 15 –24</b> (E-82 to E-73)</p>	<p><b>10-day Public Examination Period for Statement of Qualifications</b> The public examination period for offices that close during an extended nomination period. <i>Elections Code §§ 8022, 8024, 8204, 10225, 10407, 10516, 10604</i></p>
<p><b>August 29</b> (E-68)</p>	<p><b>Certified List of Candidates for Federal and State Offices</b> The Secretary of State will issue the certified list of candidates. <i>Elections Code §§ 8147-8150</i></p>
<p><b>September 6 –21</b> (E-60 to E-45)</p>	<p><b>Military / Overseas Vote by Mail Ballots</b> Mailing and processing period for military and overseas voters. <i>Elections Code §§ 300, 3101-3123</i></p>
<p><b>September 9 – October 22</b> (E-57 to E-14)</p>	<p><b>Write-in Candidacy Period</b> Candidates may pick up write-in candidacy nomination papers at the Registrar of Voters Office anytime between these dates. <i>Elections Code § 8600-8606</i></p>

<p><b>September 26</b> (E-40)</p>	<p><b>County Voter Information Guides are Mailed to Registered Voters</b> The Registrar of Voters Office will begin mailing the County Voter Information Guides to registered voters. <i>Elections Code § 13303</i></p> <p><b>First Pre-election Financial Statement Due</b> Last day for candidates listed on the ballot to file Form 460 or Form 470. Period Covered: 7/1/24 – 9/21/24 <i>Government Code §§ 84200.5, 84200.8, 84218</i></p>
<p><b>October 7 – November 4</b> (E-29 to E-1)</p>	<p><b>Vote by Mail Ballot Mailing</b> <u>No later than</u> E-29, the Registrar of Voters will mail vote-by-mail ballots to all registered voters. <i>Elections Code § 4005(a)(1)(B)</i></p> <p><b>Early Voting Begins</b> Voters may vote in person or drop off a ballot at the Registrar of Voters Office. <i>Elections Code §§ 3001, 3200-3206</i></p>
<p><b>October 7</b> (E-29)</p>	<p><b>Official Ballot Drop Box Deployment</b> ROV drop box locations will be printed in the County Voter Information Guide. <i>Elections Code § 3025.5(a)(b)</i></p>
<p><b>October 21</b> (E-15)</p>	<p><b>Last Day to Register to Vote</b> Deadline to register to vote for this Election. Postmarks, DMV submissions, and elections office delivery/drop-off are acceptable. <i>Elections Code §§ 1070-2171, 2102</i></p>
<p><b>October 22 – November 5</b> (E-14 – E-Day)</p>	<p><b>Conditional Voter Registration</b> Eligible voters who missed the 15-day close may appear in person at the Registrar of Voters Office or a polling place on Election Day and register to vote provisionally for this election. <i>Elections Code § 2170</i></p>
<p><b>October 24</b> (E-12)</p>	<p><b>Second Pre-election Financial Statement Due</b> Last day for committees to file Form 460. Period Covered: 9/22/24 – 10/19/24 <i>Government Code §§ 84200.5, 84200.8(b), 84218</i></p>
<p><b>October 25</b> (E-11) SOS Designated Date</p>	<p><b>Certified List of Nonpartisan Write-in Candidates</b> The Secretary of State will prepare and send a certified list of write-in candidates to be affected county officials and each candidate running in the affected offices. <i>Elections Code §§ 6241, 6441, 6621, 6822</i></p>
<p><b>November 5</b> (E-0)</p>	<p><b>Election Day</b> All polling places are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. for drop-off or in-person voting. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by this date. <i>Elections Code §§ 1000, 1500, 14212</i></p>

<p><b>November 6</b> (E+1)</p>	<p><b>Semifinal Official Canvass</b> Beginning at 8 a.m. until completed, the Registrar of Voters Office conducts the semifinal official canvass of votes and reports the totals to the SOS. <i>Elections Code §§ 15150, 15151</i></p>
<p><b>December 2</b> (E+27)</p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed State Assembly District and State Senators Will Take Office</b> Assembly Members and Senators will take office on the first Monday in December following the election. <i>California Constitution Article IV § 2 (a) 3</i></p>
<p><b>December 3</b> (E+28)</p>	<p><b>Official End of Canvass of the Election</b> The Registrar of Voters Office certifies election results; the governing bodies consolidated with this election receive a certified statement of the votes. <i>Elections Code §§ 15301, 15372, 15375</i></p> <p><b>Refunds of Excess SOQ Payments</b> The Registrar of Voters Office issues refunds to candidates if applicable. <i>Elections Code § 13307 (d)</i></p>
<p><b>December 6</b> (E+31)</p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed Special District Officials Will Take Office</b> Governing board members of a special district take office at noon on the first Friday in December following the election. <i>Elections Code § 10554</i></p>
<p><b>December 13</b> (E+38)</p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed School District Officials Will Take Office</b> Governing board members of a school district or community college district take office on the second Friday of December following the election. <i>Education Code § 5017</i></p> <p><b>Statement of the Votes Filed</b> Deadline for the SOS to compile and file the statement of the votes for this election. <i>Elections Code § 15500, 15501, 15503</i></p>
<p><b>December</b> (Confirm the actual date with your city clerk)</p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed Municipal District Officials Will Take Office</b> Escalon, Lathrop, Lodi, Manteca, Ripon, and Tracy City Mayors and Council Members will take office at the first council meeting in December following the election.</p>
<p><b>January 1, 2025</b></p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed City of Stockton Officials Will Take Office</b> All Council Members will take office on January 1st of the year following the election. <i>Stockton Municipal Code Article VI § 601</i></p>

<p><b>January 6, 2025</b></p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed Judges of the Supreme Court and Judges of Superior Courts Will Take Office</b> Judges will take office on the first Monday after January 1st following the election. <i>California Constitution Article VI § 16</i></p> <p><b>Elected and Appointed County Officers Will Take Office</b> County officers will take office at noon on the 1st Monday after January 1st succeeding their election. <i>Government Code § 24200</i></p>
<p><b>January 2025</b></p>	<p><b>Elected and Appointed United States Officials Will Take Office</b> U.S. Senators and U.S. Representatives will take office at noon on the 3rd day of January. U.S. President and U.S. Vice Presidents will take office at noon on the 20th day of January. <i>United States Constitution 12th Amendment</i></p>
<p><b>January 31, 2025</b></p>	<p><b>Semi-annual Campaign Statement</b> Last day for all required candidates, organizations, and committees to file semi-annual campaign statements. Period Covered: 10/20/24 – 12/31/24 <i>Government Code §§ 84200, 84218</i></p>

\*Notwithstanding any other provision of the law, whenever the deadline falls on a weekend or holiday the conduction of the action is on the next business day.

**The ROV has no authority to extend filing deadlines established by law. The candidate must be aware of all deadlines and make sure that they file their appropriate documents and forms before the deadline.**
